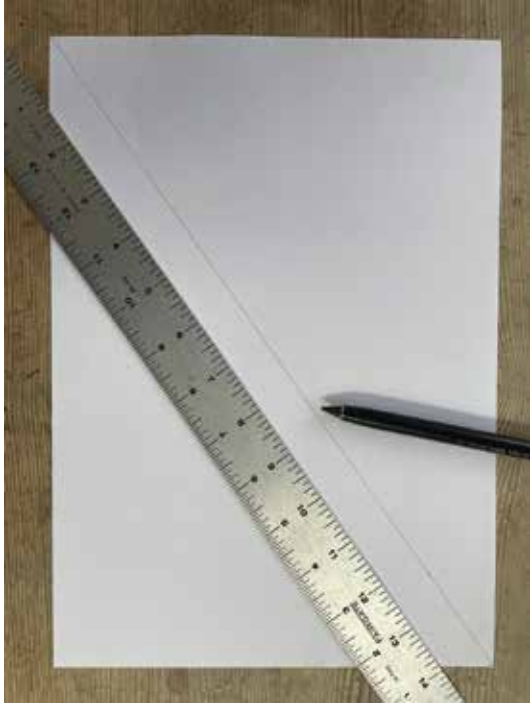
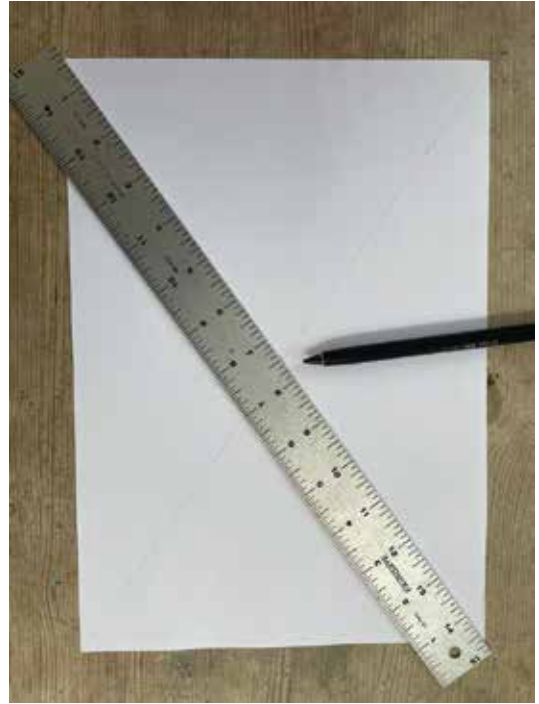


# MAKING THE QUILT TEMPLATE

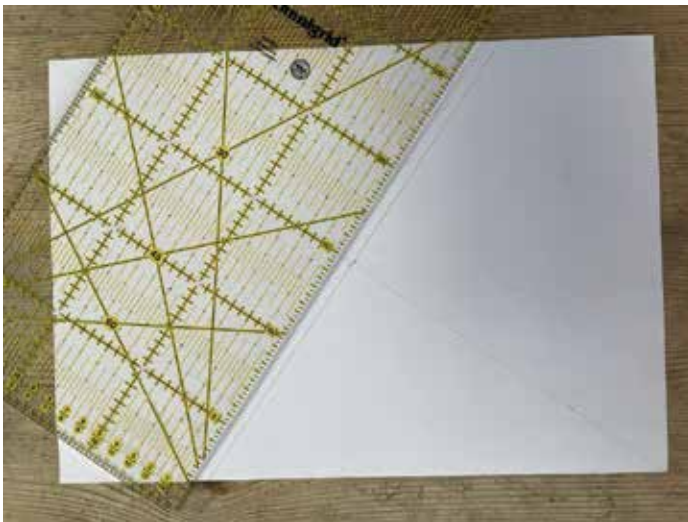
1. Draw a line corner to corner on an A4 piece of paper



2. Mark the centre of the line



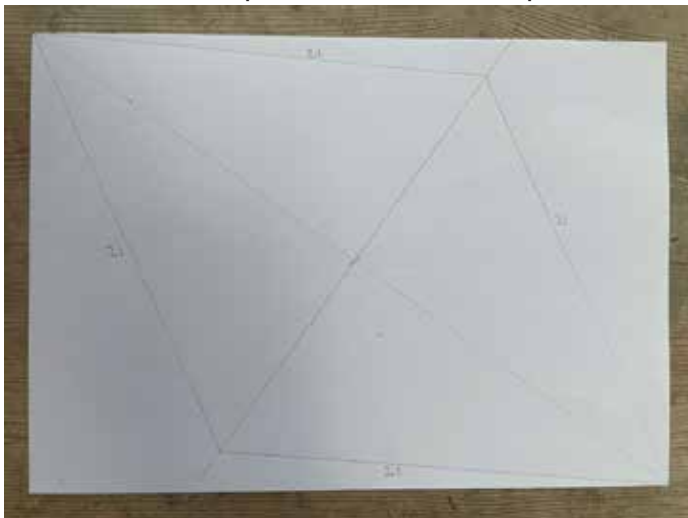
3. Draw a line through this centre point at right angles to the first line making a cross



4. Starting in one corner, draw lines 21cm long to make a diamond shape



5. All 4 sides should be 21cm long. Cut the diamond out to use as a template to cut the fabric pieces out



# MAKING THE QUILT BLOCKS

These are the quilt blocks. Each one is made up of 3 diamonds sewn together.



General rule:

- Please choose 3 fabrics that are the same tones/colours as each other
- Please use medium weight fabrics, similar in weight to a cotton shirt. Any fabric composition is fine
  - Please choose one pale fabric to go at the top - It can have a subtle pattern
  - One darker solid colour fabric for the bottom right - this can be patterned
  - One patterned fabric for the bottom left

1. Place the diamond onto the Fabric.  
Grain direction doesn't matter

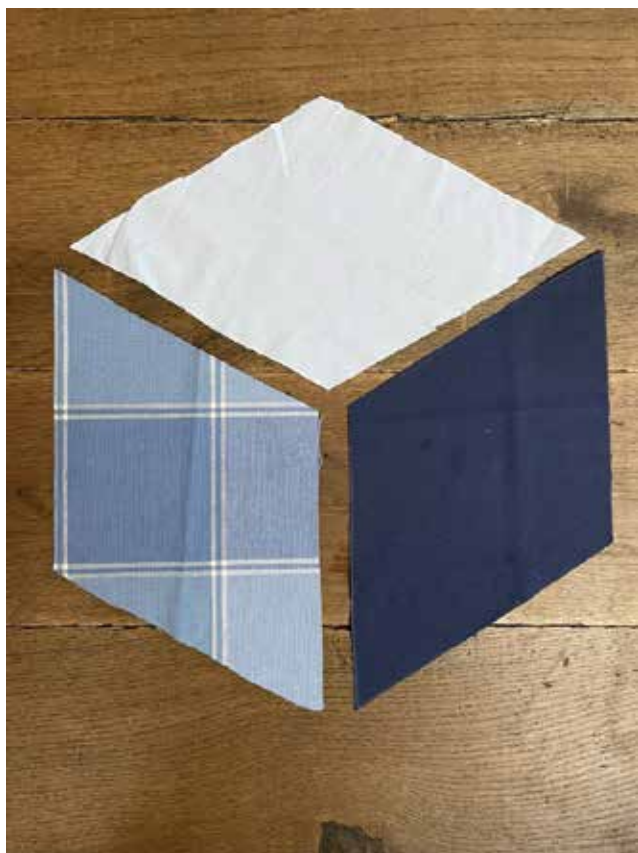


2. Draw round the diamond using chalk or a fabric pen





3. Cut all 3 fabric diamonds and lay them out in their positions



4. Sew them together with a 1cm seam allowance. This can be either on a sewing machine or by hand.

I find it easiest to work from centre point outwards



5. Use an iron to press the seams open flat
